# BUCKLE UP PHONE DOWN DAY

#### THE PROBLEM

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, an estimated 42,795 people were killed in traffic crashes in 2022.

Distracted driving claimed at least 3,522 lives nationwide in 2021 alone. And thousands of additional lives could have been saved with the use of seat belts.

With no primary seat belt law or an all-driver texting ban (at the time), Missouri looked for a new approach to reversing these dangerous trends. The new secondary hands-free law went into affect as of August 28, 2023.



#### THE GOALS

October 25 is BUPD Day.

This year, our goal is a zero-fatality BUPD Day.

To get there, we must change driver behavior for the better, including increased seat belt usage rates and fewer distracted driving crashes.
